- 3.26 Major Activities during the year in the sphere of extension activities and Institutional Social Responsibility
 - Sahitya Vedi, that has brought name & fame to our institution in the past, had a good start during this academic year as well. The programmes were coordinated by the well known writer, environmentalist and head of the department of Malayalam Dr. Ambikasuthan Mangad. It has conducted almost 20 programmes in this year. Cartoon workshop, Nattarivu Padasala, House Construction with the financial aid of Suresh Gopi were some of the programmes. It constructed two houses this year and handed over them to two hapless endosulfan victims. Foundation stone has been laid for the third house of the kind.
 - NSS has started the construction of a house for a poor woman at adopted village of Boothanam Colony with the help of staff members and public. The construction work is half way ahead.

- The NSS Units conducted two blood donation camps on 24/7/2013 and 21/1/2014, in which 101 NSS volunteers donated blood.
- The NSS Units distributed a wheel chair to a physically challenged individual on 27-07-13.
- Dr. A Mohanan of Department of Chemistry conducted an awareness class on Plastics prasnavum pariharavum (Plastics – Problems and Solutions) for the public at M.N.Smaraka Vayanasala at Payam, Bedadka on 29th December 2013.
- For helping the poor patients usable medicines were collected from the students and staff by fixing a Medicine Box near the college office and distributed to the patients in collaboration with the Pain and Palliative Care centre, Nileshwar.
- The NCC cadets of Nehru Arts and Science College planted 100 saplings at the college premises and pledged to preserve the plants Arrangements were made for proper fencing and watering.
- The NCC unit and Alumni Association of Nehru Arts and Science College, Kanhangad in co-operation with the Hope Charitable Trust, Pilathara conducted "Treatment Support Programme" to train the NCC cadets to the Palliative patients.
- The NCC unit of Nehru Arts and Science College, Kanhangad hosted the family get together of the palliative patients at the College in association with the Lions Club of Nileshwar North and Noleshwaram Karuna Palliative Care Society. 80 palliative patients with their families, NCC cadets, and palliative volunteers attended the programme..Cultural programmes were staged and distributed kits to the palliative patients.

5.4 Details of student support mechanism for coaching for competitive examinations (If any)

The college has two tier system for supporting the students in their performances in competitive examinations. The CCIG (Centre for Career Information and Guidance) organises coaching classes, counselling classes at the college level.

The Centre for Career Guidance and Information conducted various activities in the year 2015-16 to help the students in their career development. Job opportunities, employment news and Campus interviews were informed to the students time to time and students of our College got placements in several companies. The CCIG gave advices to the students in their doubts about qualifications and other criteria for admissions in to various courses and jobs. Several students got jobs in Government sector also.

Army Recruitment training

The CCIG, Career Club and NCC unit of Nehru Arts and Science College, Kanhangad conducted free training for Armed forces recruitment physical test at Nehru College ground on 18 October 2015. Candidates from different parts of Kannur and Kasaragod districts were trained in running, jumping, pull up and balancing by the physical trainers Manoj Pallikkera and K V Prashanth.

Career opportunities in Armed Forces class conducted

The CCIG, Career Club and NCC unit of Nehru Arts and Science College, Kanhangad conducted Career opportunities in Armed Forces class on 8 September 2015. Lieutenant Colonel T Murali, Administrative Officer of 32 Kerala Battalion NCC, Payyanur handled class on Career opportunities in Armed Forces.

Seminar on "Fitness, Exercises, and Diet and Job opportunities in Fitness field" conducted

The CCIG, Career Club and NCC unit of Nehru Arts and Science College, Kanhangad conducted Seminar on the topic, "Fitness, Exercises and Diet" at the College Conference Hall. The programme was inaugurated by International Fitness and Personal Trainer Krishnan Namibiar.

Wisdom 2016

The Centre for Career Guidance and Information, Career Club and NCC unit of Nehru Arts and Science College, Kanhangad in association with the Kasaragod Career Guidance and Development Cell organised 'Wisdom- 2016' programme at Nehru Arts and Science College, Kanhangad. 100 selected students participated in the programme. The programme was designed to guide the students to select higher courses and suitable jobs. Classes were handled by research students of Kerala Central University and gave a clear picture to the students about the post graduate courses offered by the Central Universities of India. Shailaja P, Bijesh V and Vidhya P V handled classes.

NET/SET Examinations Coaching classes conducted

The Association in cooperation with the CCIG and Career Club conducted the SET examination coaching classes for the Commerce candidates from December 2015 to June 2016. For commerce 95 percentage of the participants successfully cleared the SET examination and qualified for appointment as higher secondary teachers (while the state average was 12% for commerce). The concluding session of the SET coaching classes was held on 24.01.2016. NET coaching classes were held from September to December 2015.

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6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

There are 13 faculty in the college who serve as members of Boards of Studies of different subjects in the Kannur University. Two of them are serving as board chairmen. However s the syllabi of the UG and PG programmes were revised by the university during the last year, there was no activities in this dimension during this year.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Assesses the learning levels of the students in the commencement of the course. This helps to identify the slow learners and to design special coaching sessions or tutorial sessions to bridge the gap between the slow learners and the advanced learners.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Internal examinations are conducted periodically following the university patterns. Students are also required to submit assignments, projects and make presentations in seminars.

The continuous evaluation component of the evaluation bears 20% of the total marks in each course. The assessment is based on a predetermined transparent system involving written tests, assignments/seminars/viva and attendance in respect of theory courses and lab involvement and records, tests and attendance in respect of practical courses.

Results of the continuous evaluation are published on the department notice board and transparency is ensured

6.3.4 Research and Development

There is a research forum in the college that promotes the research activities in the college. The forum encourages teachers research activities and help the students to families the research methodology. A good collection of books, e-books and e-journals is available in the Library. Apart from this, students and staff have unlimited and free access to internet. The college library is computerised and manages its transactions by software. Teachers and students have the facility to browse journals through INFLIBNET. N-LIST is subscribed to enable the teachers and students to refer a large number of online journals. Apart from that hard copies important journals in all subjects are made available. Usage of smart board and LCD projectors are promoted among teachers as well as students. During the year2015-'16, the library of the college purchased 1815 text books and 52 reference books. There is also a mini library in the Women's hostel. Browsing facility using software KOHA is available.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

All faculty and students are motivated to get involve in the maximum number of activities that will benefit the teaching learning process in the college.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

The recruitment of faculty is done as per the government/university norms. The process involves government nominee, university nominee, subject expert and the representatives of the college and the management. The final selection is made in an interview by an interview board constituted as per the rules and guidelines specified in the Kannur University statute, which includes a Government nominee, subject expert allotted by the University and Management nominee. The rank list is prepared considering the performance of the candidates in the examination, the performance in the interview, the aptitude and attitude of the candidates etc. If the process is delayed by problems beyond the control of the college, temporary posting is done on ad hoc basis with the financial support of the PTA.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

The institution keeps good interaction with some industries to enable the students to get exposure about industrial processes. The institution encourages faculty and students to take up projects sponsored by the Government funding agencies and to pursue research.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

The admission is done strictly according to merit. The university introduced the Online Single window System for UG admission in the academic year 2015-16.
