1. Accreditation Preparation.

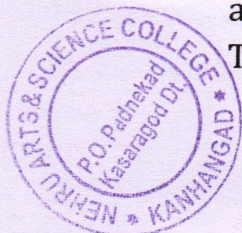
Currently, the college is preparing for its fourth cycle of accreditation, with numerous quality enhancement measures underway.

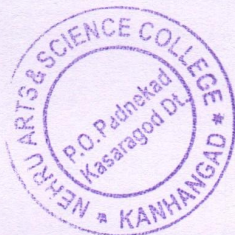

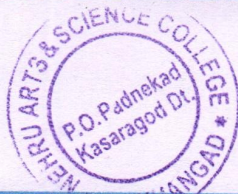

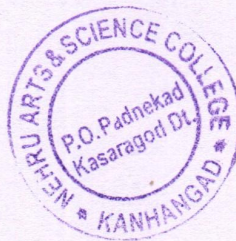
